
## ALL DRESSED UP Jilly Gagnon

When Becca's husband surprises her with a 1920s-themed murder mystery weekend at a gorgeous old estate outside the city, she knows it's his way of making amends. Their marriage was in trouble well before the affair, but ever since then Blake's been in fix-it mode, while Becca's still deciding if there's anything worth fixing between them. But this weekend is right up her alley, and for once she gives herself permission to enjoy the escape. The hotel's gorgeous, the drinks are strong, and it's been a while since they've had a chance to get all dressed up. Here, they can slip into their assigned roles (Miss Debbie Taunte and Mr. Reid A. Daily, thank you very much), and leave their problems behind.

Until the morning after they arrive, when the employee/aspiring actress playing the role of the maid fails to show up for work. Her colleagues are sure this is just the latest in a long line of flaky behavior and are only concerned insomuch as her absence affects their ability to keep the production running smoothly. But Becca isn't sure. It might just be all the mystery novels and detective shows - with their nice, neat endings - she's been consuming nonstop as a way of self-soothing, or the fact that no 20-something would leave their phone behind in the middle of the night, but she can't shake the feeling that there's something a little off about the whole weekend - from the way the guests are sneaking around to the fact that none of the game's clues are lining up quite right. After all, wouldn't a murder mystery game provide the perfect disguise for something truly sinister?

Told over the course of 48 hours and interspersed with clues, set pieces, and character histories from the 1920s mystery that runs parallel to the real-life one, ALL DRESSED UP is a clever mix of punny riddles and a deep-dive into the secrets people keep behind their shiny facades. Set at a secluded, atmospheric hotel with plenty of Gatsby-era glamour and a lively group of suspects guests, it's reminiscent of The Guest List or The Woman in Cabin 10, with a focus on marriage and all the secrets couples keep-both from each other, and from the outside world.


When an oncology nurse is diagnosed with cancer, she has to confront the most critical, terrified, angry patient she's ever encountered: herself.

In short, spare chapters, bestselling author Theresa Brown tells a poignant, powerful, and intensely personal story about breast cancer. She brings us along with her, beginning with the mammogram that would change her life, then through her diagnosis, treatment, and recovery. Knowing how hard she worked to bring empathy to her nursing, she finds herself repeatedly surprised by the lack of compassion in the medical maze she finds herself in, something so many other patients have experienced. She wonders why she is expected to wait over a long weekend to hear if she actually has cancer. She's hurt when doctors and administrators are self-absorbed and insensitive. She wants clear explanations of procedures and the course of treatment, but rarely gets them. She's dismayed at feeling like a widget on the health care assembly line, but fears being the "difficult" patient who ends up getting worse care because she complained.

Interspersed are pointed looks back at some of her own cases as a nurse, now reevaluated from her new perch as a patient. With rare candor she considers what she didn't know then and what she could have done better. As in her previous books, Brown draws us into her work with the unforgettable details of a nurse's daily life—the needles, the chemo drugs, the blood transfusions, and the frustrated patients, but this time we see it from the flip side, too. Ultimately Brown learns to be more compassionate with herself, to be a patient not a nurse, and she also offers suggestions about how healthcare can show more compassion to the millions of patients who rely on it.



By demonstrating how and why violence was the most salient factor underwriting Britain's empire and the nation's imperial identity at home, Elkins upends long-held myths and sheds new light on empire's role in shaping the world today.



Caroline Elkins is professor of history and of African and African American studies at Harvard University and the founding director of Harvard's Center for African Studies. Her first book, Imperial Reckoning: The Untold Story of Britain's Gulag in Kenya, was awarded the 2006 Pulitzer Prize for General Nonfiction. She is a contributor to The New York Times Book Review, The Guardian, The Atlantic, The Washington Post, and The New Republic. She has also appeared on numerous radio and television programs, including NPR's All Things Considered and BBC's The World. She lives in Cambridge, Massachusetts.


There is no hotter topic than the desire to constrain tech companies like Facebook from exploiting our personal data, or to keep Alexa from spying on you. Privacy has also provoked constitutional crisis (presidential tax returns) while Justice Clarence Thomas seeks to remove the protection of journalists who publish the truth about public officials. Is privacy under deadly siege, or actually surging?

The answer is both, but that's doubly dangerous, as legal expert Amy Gajda proves. Too little privacy means that unwanted exposure by those who deal in and publish secrets. Too much means the famous and infamous can cloak themselves in secrecy and shut down inquiry, and return us to the time before movements like Black Lives Matter and #MeToo opened eyes to hidden truths.

We are not the first generation to grapple with that clash, to worry that new technologies and fraying social mores pose an existential threat to our privacy while we recognize the value in knowing certain things. The Twisted History of the Right to Privacy carries us from the Gilded Age, when the concept of a right to privacy by name first entered American law and society, to now, when the law allows a Silicon Valley titan like Peter Thiel to destroy a media site like Gawker out of spite.

Disturbingly, she shows that the original concern was not about intrusions into the lives of ordinary folks, but that the wealthy and powerful should not have their dignity assaulted by the wretches of the popular press like Nellie Bly. Alexander Hamilton argued both sides of the issue depending on what it was being known, and about whom. The modern right is anchored in a landmark 1890 essay by Louis Brandeis before he joined the Supreme Court, where he continued his instrumental support for the "privacies of life." In the 1960s, privacy interests gave way to the glory days of investigative reporting in the era of Vietnam and Watergate. By the 1990s we were on our way to today's full-blown crisis of privacy in the digital age, from websites to webcams and the Forever Internet erasing our "right to be forgotten." Or does it?

We stand today at another crossroads in which privacy is widely believed to be under assault from every direction by the anything-for-clicks business model and technology that can record and report our every move. This timely book reminds us to remember the lessons of history: that such a seemingly innocent call can also be used to restrict essential freedoms to a democracy--because it already has.





They began as progressives but soon turned to socialism, then communism. They founded theaters, periodicals, and art schools. They formed editorial boards that met in beach shacks and performed radical new plays in a shanty on the docks where they could see the ocean through cracks in the floor. They welcomed the tremendous wave of talent fleeing Europe in the 1930s. At the end of their era, as the postwar economy boomed, they took shelter in liberalism as the anti-capitalist movement fragmented into other causes in the 1960's.

John Taylor "Ike" Williams, who married into the Cape's artistic world and has spent fifty years talking and walking its shores with these cultural and political revolutionaries, gives us the twisting lives and careers of a staggering generation of American thinkers and creators. The Shores of Bohemia records a great set of shifts in American culture, of ideas and arguments fueled by drink, infidelity, and competition that made for a fifty-year coversation among intellectual leaders and creative revolutionaries, who found a community as they created some of the great works of the American century. This is their story. Welcome to the party!
