



But with a mom hard at work in a rundown sweatshop and three younger siblings to feed, Nura must spend her days earning money in the same mica mines she lost her father to. But it's not just the extra rupees in her pocket Nura is after. Local rumor has it that there's buried treasure in the mine, and Nura knows if she could find it, she could change the course of her family's life forever.

When the mines collapse and four kids, including Faisal, are claimed dead, Nura refuses to believe it and shovels her way through the dirt hoping to find him. Instead she finds herself at the entrance to a strange world of purple skies and pink seas. (So, she's pretty sure she's dead.) There, her qareen, a character she thought only existed in her mother's stories, invites her to a luxury jinn hotel, where she's given everything she could ever want—herbal baths, enticing sweets, and a plush bed she could almost drown in.


But there's a dark truth lurking beneath all that glitter and gold, and when Nura crosses the owner's son and is banished to the working quarters to pay back her debt, she realizes she isn't the only human who's ended up in the hotel's clutches. Faisal and the other missing children are there too, and if Nura can't find a way to help them escape, they'll be bound to work for the hotel forever and never see their families again—let alone taste another sweet gulab.

M.T. Khan uses the haunting jinn stories and myths of her childhood, told while growing up in a Muslim household, to speak on the realities of living in poverty, the exploitation of children, and ultimately, the power of education.

THE LEGEND OF AUNTIE PO

Shing Yin Khor

Part historical fiction, part magical realism, and 100 percent adventure. Thirteen-year-old Mei reimagines the myths of Paul Bunyan as starring a Chinese heroine while she works in a Sierra Nevada logging camp in 1885.

Aware of the racial tumult in the years after the passage of the Chinese Exclusion Act, Mei tries to remain blissfully focused on her job, her close friendship with the camp foreman's daughter, and telling stories about Paul Bunyan--reinvented as Po Pan Yin (Auntie Po), an elderly Chinese matriarch.

Anchoring herself with stories of Auntie Po, Mei navigates the difficulty and politics of lumber camp work and her growing romantic feelings for her friend Bee. The Legend of Auntie Po is about who gets to own a myth, and about immigrant families and communities holding on to rituals and traditions while staking out their own place in America.




Two sisters must fight to the death to win the crown in this first installment of a gripping, action-packed duology set in an ancient North African-inspired fantasy world.


LOVE SCENES

Margaret Burnham

Margaret Burnham's vividly rendered narratives merge into a single forceful tide, a moving testimonial that lays out in horrifying detail the antecedents of the police murders of black victims that we are reading about in all our headlines today

In 2007, former Judge Margaret Burnham, professor of law at Northeastern University and an active civil rights lawyer, won a revived "cold case"—for the 1964 murder of black teenagers Charles Eddie Moore and Henry Hezekiah Dee in rural Mississippi. She decided to put her fee for the job toward recovering the stories of other, earlier Jim Crow cold cases from the 1930s, '40s, and '50s before the witnesses and surviving victims in those cases were dead. Thirteen years later, an archive of roughly 1,000 well-developed cases has been built by dozens of lawyers, journalists, and historians who delved into legal records and went to various cities in the South and in the North to interview family members and witnesses. The purpose was "restorative justice," and Burnham named her undertaking the Civil Rights & Restorative Justice Project (CR&RJ), which continues strong today thanks to funding from the Ford, Carnegie, and Mellon foundations as well as support from Northeastern University. Burnham's book draws on the author's long experience, her own research, and above all on the extraordinary archive she and the CR&RJ have created.

Margaret Burnham is a member of the faculty of Northeastern University School of Law, where she heads the Civil Rights and Restorative Justice Project. In 1977, she became the first African American woman to serve in the Massachusetts judiciary, when she joined the Boston Municipal Court bench as an associate justice. South African president Nelson Mandela appointed Professor Burnham to serve on an international human rights commission to investigate alleged human rights violations within the African National Congress. The commission was a precursor to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission. A former fellow of the Bunting Institute at Radcliffe College and Harvard University's W.E.B. DuBois Institute for Afro-American Studies, Professor Burnham has written extensively on contemporary legal and political issues.






